

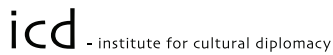

<p>“Women, Islam and Interdependence” will explore the role of Islam as a religious and cultural setting for women’s lives, work and rights in an interdependent world where cultures can no longer be isolated; it will examine the role of patriarchy as the overriding issue for women, rather than religion per se.</p>	<p>“Women, Development and Interdependence” will explore the role of women in strategies of economic development in an interdependent world where multilateral institutions have a significant impact. Policies that put a premium on women such as microcredit will be examined; the role of religion (Christianity, Judaism and Hinduism as well as Islam) will be explored – for example in terms of the Muslim ban on usury.</p>
