VG. Über Lebenskunst Project Visits: For the afternoon sessions, delegates will visit one of four Über Lebenskunst projects:

#### 1. Prinzessinnengärten (Princess gardens)

Nomadisch Grün (Nomadic Green) launched *Prinzessinnengärten* (Princess gardens) as a pilot project in the summer of 2009 at Moritzplatz in Berlin Kreuzberg, a site which had been a wasteland for over half a century. Along with friends, fans, activists and neighbours, the group cleared away rubbish, built transportable organic vegetable plots and reaped the first fruits of their labour. "In future ever more people will be living in cities rather than in rural areas. The city will therefore become the decisive place for the development of more sustainable ways of eating, living and moving. The city of the future should be a climate-friendly, pleasant place to live, where every care is taken to conserve our natural resources.

*Prinzessinnengärten* is a new urban place of learning. It is where locals can come together to experiment and discover more about organic food production, biodiversity and climate protection. The space will help them adapt to climate change and learn about healthy eating, sustainable living and a future-oriented urban lifestyle. With this project Nomadisch Grün intends to increase biological, social and cultural diversity in the neighbourhood and pioneer a new way of living together in the city."

The project "*Prinzessinnengärten*" hosts different projects that primarily address the children and adolescents living in the surrounding areas. It includes also a cafeteria and an exhibition space. From 09/24 to 09/30 it will host the international workshop "Urban Farming and Local Empowerment". "*Prinzessinnengärten*" is being supported by numerous public and private institutions.

#### 2. Kunst-Stoffe ("art-material")

*Kunst-Stoffe* is a collection and distribution centre for scraps and trash that can be creatively reused for art and culture, situated in Berlin-Friedrichshain. Materials such as fabric, paint, metal, wood, tiles, plastic, foam, cardboard, etc. that are of no further use or value to their owners are collected in the warehouse where they are made available to artists, cultural, educational and social organizations. By that, *Kunst-Stoffe* tries to stimulate creativity and environmental awareness. In order to foster a sustainable cultural development *Kunst-Stoffe* in cooperation with its partners offers workshops with different subjects for every age group and organizes cultural and social events.

"In these times of ever-declining public funding for culture, alternative resources are badly needed. *Kunst-Stoffe* provides you with a wide range of and a vast quantity of materials that are constantly in flux. In addition crafts(wo)men are invited to rent our professionally-equipped work spaces for woodworking, metal and textile production."

*Kunst-Stoffe* hosts the Museum of contemporary TrashArt (MocTA), which exhibits "Street and TrashArt". In its international artists' program *Kunst-Stoffe* together with its partners provides financial support and working space for "Artists in Residence".

#### 3. Wriezener Freiraum Labor (Wriezen's open space laboratory)

On the site of the former freight depot "Wriezener Bahnhof", situated in the district of Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg, a public park is about to emerge. In order to gather ideas for the

gentrification of this long neglected industrial area a civil initiative was brought into being in 2005. This initiative decided that the park and numerous related projects were to be realised by joint effort of local residents, students, businesses and local initiatives. The overall goal for this creation of public space is the appropriation and use of the former depot by people of all ages. The main challenge consists of creating a public open space, which is open for many functions and which increases the district's living quality.

Every third Thursday of the month Public *Jours fixes* are being implemented where interested citizens can find information about the project and participate. Other activities include workshops and seminars.

The project is being supported by the German Federal Ministry of Transport, Building and Urban Affairs. It participated successfully in the call for projects for the ministry's program "Innovations for family and senior friendly urban quarters" in the category "Design of urban open spaces - public space for all generations".

#### 4. Blo-Ateliers (BLO-studios)

In 2005 a group of artists searched for new accommodation because they were forced to abandon their "artists' colony" in Berlin-Mitte. They found their new home near the train station Berlin-Lichtenberg (BLO) in an abandoned but historically and architecturally valuable building complex formerly belonging to the German Railway. With the financial help of the European Community Initiative Urban II the newly founded society "Lockkunst e.V.", which comprises more than 40 artists, was able to renovate five large buildings and create studios and workshops.

A wide array of local and international artists such as painters, fashion designers, actors, sculptors, installation artists, photographers and even circus artists have settled down in the formerly unattended area. *Blo-Ateliers* host open days, exhibitions, workshops and arts´ festivals in order to connect with the local residents and interested visitors.

*Blo-Ateliers* is a successful example of the gentrification of an outlying quarter in the former Eastern part of Berlin.
